

Red-Shouldered Hawk: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

I can keep my head still even if my perch moves

> I can see ultraviolet trails that my prey leaves behind

> > I sometimes hunt at night



Eastern Box Turtle: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

I am the official reptile of North Carolina (and Tennessee)

I don't like to share and can be very territorial

Some of my friends have been known to live as long as 100 years



Barred Owl: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

I might have multiple mates in my lifetime

> I can turn my head 270 degrees

I cannot move my eyeballs



Eastern Screech Owl: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

Sometimes I share my nest with small snakes who eat parasitic insects

I have twice the amount of veretebrae in my neck than humans -14!

I am named after the sound I make (screech)



Rat Snake: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

Climbing trees is very easy for me

> I can make my head look more triangular to confuse predators

> > I don't actually eat rats



Mole Kingsnake: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

I normally spend my time underground

My pattern gets more distinct as I age

I am called a "kingsnake" because I like to eat other snakes



Red-Tailed Hawk: 2 Truths, 1 Lie

I am one of the largest birds in North America

> You can hear my call in movies -Hollywood thinks I sound cooler than an Eagle ;)

I grow my red tail feathers within the first year of my life





I am one of the few natural predators of skunks

I can weigh up to ten pounds

I can't digest bones, skin, fur, or feathers
